Q&A with Rita Margarita & Debbie Gilmore, Arrowsmith Programme



Rita is a mother whose son with learning difficulties made her explore many kinds of solutions that were not effective in helping him to overcome the struggles he had with the mainstream school program. Her experience led her to conclude that in the area of addressing learning difficulties there is a general belief that the brain is fixed and not changeable, and that is why students are offered accommodations and modifications, which are far from addressing and targeting the roots of the problem. A program based on Neuroplasticity changed her vision and her son's life, who is now a self-directed, confident and motivated learner.



Debbie is the Executive Director of Arrowsmith Program. Her work as a teacher, literacy adviser, assistant principal, and principal helped her understand the need to 'unlock' the potential of these students. Her role as a mother of a son with learning difficulties gave her first-hand experience of the struggles of these individuals.
